4.0 REPORTS:

Traffic – Bob Gowen for Nelson Geddes

- Presentation from ICBC Karen Kline road safety. Safety program puts \$1.8 m into communities and New Westminster got \$147,00 of that. They save \$4 for each dollar they spend on program.
- Observing 8th and McBride 82% of intersection accidents are human nature involved not motor vehicle.

- Kathrine Mahoric spoke on left turns for Cumberland & 8th ; thinking doing away with all left turns.
- 5 intersections are prioritized for lights.
- There have been 9 crashes this year at 8th & Cumberland.
- South perimeter in Surrey is to provide a route for containers on a semi-trailer. South par road is supposed to provide a route to the new Port Mann bridge – which is supposed to take our traffic away.
- East Columbia is getting money like 12th street did
- Sidewalks have been broken up by trees, both sides to Braide getting new sidewalks.
- Richmond Street is a go ahead in the spring for parking only on the river side with the centre line moved to the river side.
- Major road paving projects, centre line realign will be included in that in the spring.
- Noise complaints with trucks using their jake brakes and motorcycles. Asked for a decibel meter for traffic; enforcement council has asked for a report for this.

Community Policing – Susan Wandell

- Bob Jones will go as the alternate.
- Went with Susan to this meeting.
- Very little brought up by other associations.
- Queens Park doing well since they started closing the park at dusk; Halloween relatively quite with 110 calls – down from last year.
- Lighting at underpass at 8th & Richmond needs to be looked at.
- 2 complaint calls on house at Rickman and Massey with boat and motorhome .

5.0 NEW BUSINESS:

- Neil asked if something has been done about the pedestrian crosswalk at 8th & Cherry. Sapperton residents association will be submitting a letter to the City regarding this crosswalk.
- Nelson to take this to the traffic committee in January.
- Right turn only out of the Justice Institute only on 8th – take this to traffic as well.
- financing for 2010. Sapperton gets money from Sapperton days as well as their membership fees.
- The pancake breakfast is a major fundraiser for them.
- Resident Association Presidents’ meeting yet to take place. Bill to get this going.
